

Campus Security and Law Enforcement Coordination

Campus Security Coordination with State and Local Law Enforcement Agencies

Campus security is coordinated through the Director's Office. New Age Training does not maintain a campus police department. The Director's Office enforces school policies, responds to reported incidents, and contacts local law enforcement when appropriate.

When necessary, New Age Training School will press charges against criminal violators.

The school prepares this report to comply with the Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Crime Statistics Act (Clery Act). This report is prepared in cooperation with local law enforcement agencies. Nothing in the law shall be construed to permit a school to retaliate, intimidate, threaten, coerce, or otherwise discriminate against any individual with respect to the implementation of the Clery Act.

Our school attempts to provide students and employees with a safe and secure environment in which to study and work. The school is open during posted hours. School facilities are secure during times the school is not open. All classrooms and corridors are under 24-hour video camera surveillance.

Campus Security / Personal Safety

While the school attempts to provide a safe and secure environment, students, faculty, staff and campus visitors are ultimately responsible for their safety. Safety is enhanced when students and employees take precautions such as:

- Report all suspicious activity to the Director's Office immediately
- Never take personal safety for granted.
- Avoid walking alone at night. Travel with a friend or companion.
- Avoid parking or walking in secluded or dimly lit areas.
- Limit your alcohol consumption, and leave social functions that get too loud, too crowded, or that have too many people drinking excessively.
- Carry only small amounts of cash.
- Never leave valuables (wallets, purses, books, computers, etc.) unattended.
- Carry your keys with you at all times and don't lend them to anyone.
- Lock your car doors and close the windows when leaving your car.
- Never leave valuables in your car especially if they are easily noticeable.
- Inventory your personal property and make records of the serial numbers of all items of value.

As the school becomes aware of relevant programs that address responsible practices and procedures that enhance personal safety, such information may be obtained on-campus with the School Director.

Reporting a Crime

Students and employees should promptly report crimes, suspicious activity, or other emergencies occurring on campus to the School Director/Director's Office, Room 812, or the Front Desk. Criminal activity should also be reported to local law enforcement.

In an emergency, call 911. Reports made to the School Director or other designated school officials will be reviewed for appropriate action and inclusion in the school's annual crime statistics when required. **The local Police Department may be reached at 212-239-9811.**

The Front Desk Office has authority to determine whether individuals have lawful business at the school and may request identification to make that determination. In addition, the Director's Office and Education Department Office have the authority to ensure that school policies, such as break time and building access, are followed. The school works with local law enforcement agencies and refers criminal incidents to the local police department having jurisdiction over such matters.

The Director's Office will work with local law enforcement, as appropriate, when a crime is reported. Crimes reported to the Director's Office are included in the annual campus crime statistics. In addition, the school requests from the local Police Department crime information not reported to the Director's Office that is appropriate for inclusion in the annual campus crime statistics. Further, if circumstances warrant, the school community will be notified if an on-going threat is posed related to a reported crime.

Individuals who do not wish to pursue action through the school or criminal justice system may still make a voluntary confidential report to the Director's Office. Such reports will be handled as confidentially as possible and included in annual crime statistics when required, without personally identifying the victim.

Timely Warnings And Emergency Notifications

When a reported crime or emergency presents a serious or continuing threat to the campus community, New Age Training will provide a timely warning or emergency notification to students and employees as appropriate. Notifications will be issued without identifying victims and through the school's available communication methods.

The school does not tolerate violence or other threatening conduct against any members of the school community. This includes criminal acts against persons or property, as well as harassment based on sex, race, ethnicity, or disability. The school will impose strict disciplinary actions and appropriately involve law enforcement officials should any acts of violence or threatening conduct occur on school facilities or at school-sponsored events. This includes acts of violence against women.

In addition to any criminal sanctions, the school will impose appropriate disciplinary sanctions if the offender is a student or employee of the school. The school Director's Office should be contacted should one wish to file a complaint. Also, note that, in cases of sexual assault complaints:

- both the accuser and the accused are entitled to the same opportunities to have others present during the disciplinary hearing and
- both the accuser and the accused shall be informed of the outcome of any disciplinary proceeding based on an allegation of sexual assault.

The school will work with the victim, should it be requested, in making such changes as can reasonably be accommodated relative to the student's academic and living situations.

Emergency Response and Evacuation Procedures

New Age Training maintains emergency response and evacuation procedures. In the event of a significant emergency or dangerous situation involving an immediate threat to the health or safety of the campus community, the school will determine the appropriate response, notify affected students and employees, and initiate evacuation or other emergency procedures when necessary. Emergency procedures are periodically tested through drills, exercises or announcements.

New Age Training prohibits dating violence, domestic violence, sexual assault, and stalking. Reports of such conduct will be reviewed promptly and handled in accordance with school policy and applicable law. Students and employees may report these incidents to the Director's Office and/or local law enforcement.

In compliance to VAWA (Violence Against Women Reauthorization Act), the school Director's Office will follow an incident of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, or stalking has been reported, including a statement of the standard of evidence that will be used during any institutional conduct proceeding arising from such a report.

New Age Training is using the definition of "rape" to reflect the Federal Bureau of Investigation's (FBI) updated definition in the Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) Summary Reporting System, which encompasses the categories of rape, sodomy, and sexual assault with an object that are used the UCR National Incident-Based Reporting System.

Sexual Assault and Related Crimes

In the event of a sexual assault or domestic violence, please be aware of the following:

- * preserve any evidence of the assault (do not drink, bathe, change clothing, or comb hair, as this may destroy evidence that may be needed to prosecute the offender)
- * go to a place where it is safe from further attack and notify the police
- * report to the Director's Office any evidence of domestic violence, sexual assault, or stalking
- * obtain immediate medical attention
- * seek professional counseling and discuss with the school Director's Office available assistance in, changing academic, living, and/or transportation situations if requested and reasonably available, regardless of whether the victim chooses to report the crime to campus authorities or local law enforcement.

If requested by the student who is the victim of a sexual assault, the school will assist the student in notifying law enforcement. In addition, the school Director's Office will provide information on off-campus agencies that provide services to victims of a sex offense.

The school encourages students and employees to take advantage of the materials and programs that promote awareness of rape, acquaintance rape, and other forcible and non-forcible sex offenses available through the school and/or local community agencies. Information about such materials and programs is available at the school.

Registered Sex Offenders

The Jacob Wetterling Act requires states to obtain information concerning registered sex offenders' enrollment or employment at institutions of higher education. Those seeking to obtain information about registered sex offenders should visit the following website: www.nsopr.gov. Further, to the extent the State notifies an educational institution of information concerning registered sex offenders, the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) does not prevent educational institutions from disclosing such information.

Disciplinary Proceedings

The school will, upon written request, disclose to the alleged victim of a crime of violence, or a non-forcible sex offense, the results of any disciplinary hearing conducted by the school against the student who is the alleged perpetrator of the crime or offense. If the alleged victim is deceased as a result of the crime or offense, the school will provide the results of the disciplinary hearing to the victim's next of kin, if so requested.

Hazing Policy and Prevention

New Age Training prohibits hazing in any form. Hazing is any intentional, knowing, or reckless act committed against a person, regardless of that person's willingness to participate, in connection with initiation into, affiliation with, or continued membership in a student organization that causes or creates a risk of physical or psychological injury beyond the reasonable risks of participation in the school or organization.

Students and employees who experience, witness, or become aware of suspected hazing should promptly report it to the **School Director or Director's Office**. Reports will be reviewed and investigated promptly and appropriate disciplinary action will be taken when warranted.

New Age Training complies with applicable federal, New York State, and local hazing laws. New York Penal Law §§120.16 and 120.17 prohibit certain intentional or reckless conduct associated with initiation into or affiliation with an organization that creates a substantial risk of physical injury. New Age Training provides hazing prevention and awareness information to students and employees, including recognizing and reporting hazing, bystander intervention, responsible conduct, and alternatives to hazing that promote positive group participation.

Hate Crimes

A hate crime is a criminal offense motivated, in whole or in part, by bias. For Clery Act reporting, applicable bias categories include race, religion, gender, gender identity, sexual orientation, ethnicity, national origin, and disability.

In addition to applicable Clery criminal offenses, hate-crime reporting includes larceny-theft, simple assault, intimidation, and destruction/damage/vandalism of property.

The school reports all hate crime statistics separately for the categories of criminal offenses listed in the chart above. Additionally, hate crimes statistics are also reported separately for the following offenses:

- Larceny-theft: is the unlawful taking, carrying, leading, or riding away of property from the possession or constructive possession of another. Constructive possession is the condition in which a person does not have physical custody or possession but is in a position to exercise dominion or control over a thing.
- Simple Assault: is an unlawful physical attack by one person upon another where neither the offender displays a weapon, nor the victim suffers obvious severe or aggravated bodily injury involving apparent broken bones, loss of teeth, possible internal injury, severe laceration, or loss of consciousness.
- Intimidation: is to unlawfully place another person in reasonable fear of bodily harm through the use of threatening words and/or other conduct, but without displaying a weapon or subjecting the victim to actual physical attack.
- Destructive/Damage/Vandalism of Property: Is to willfully or maliciously destroy, damage, deface or otherwise injury real or personal property without the consent of the owner or the person having custody or control of it.
